2. United States Culture Vocabulary

- **to pledge allegiance** (verb) / **The Pledge of Allegiance** (noun) – *to promise loyalty to something; a promise to be loyal to the United States, said daily by American schoolchildren.*
- **The Star-Spangled Banner** (noun) – *the national anthem of the United States.*
- **The Stars and Stripes / The Star-Spangled Banner / Old Glory** (nouns) – *alternative names for the flag of the United States.*
- **The American Dream** (noun) – *the idea that life can be improved dramatically with the opportunities for success available in the United States.*
- **The Deep South** (noun) – *a cultural and geographic region in the far south of the United States including the states of Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina, and sometimes including Texas and northern Florida.*
- **patriotism** (noun, concept), **patriot** (noun, person), **patriotic** (adjective) – *pride or love for one's country; a person who loves their country or is proud of it.*
